

Women's Mission/Conferencia

Goal:

To provide an opportunity for women to fellowship and grow with other believers. This is done by partnering with the staff and students at the Mexican Indian Training Center by providing a weekend conference for 400-500 women.

History:

The MITC trains local Mexican Indians to be pastors and ministry leaders and sends them out to start village churches. Today, our church takes four teams annually to MITC: dental, construction, youth and women. Several pastors teach Bible conferences; college students intern there; we even have a family who spends their summer at the school. It is a relationship that our leadership considers a strategic partner ministry.

What to expect:

The MITC is located in the mountains of Southern Mexico just outside the city of Cordoba. During our five day stay the women's team will do various tasks:

- Attend the service of a new house-church; a team member will share her testimony
- Visit an orphanage, hug on kids and hand out gifts
- Walk the neighborhood around the school handing out invitations to the conference
- Clean and prepare the Bible School campus for the conference and for the guests who will spend the night
- During the conference we will: sing with the students, teach crafts, help with workshops, and rotate team members to work with the kids program or in the kitchen
